ABOUT OUR EMCEE

Former State Senator Eric H. Kearney of Cincinnati (9th district) served in the Ohio Senate from 2005 until 2015. Kearney was the sponsor of Senate Bill 84, establishing the position of Ohio Poet Laureate and signed into law by Governor John R. Kasich. Kearney argued eloquently on the Senate floor for Ohio to have its own Poet Laureate, reciting a haiku, referencing Ohio's many great poets, and quoting former U.S. Poet Laureate and Ohio native Rita Dove on the importance of poetry: "If we're going to solve the problems of the world, we have to learn how to talk to one another....Poetry is the language at its essence. It is the bones and skeleton of language. It teaches you, if nothing else, how to choose your words." During his years in the Senate, Kearney served as Minority Leader for the 130th General Assembly and as treasurer of the Ohio Legislative Black Caucus. Kearney received a B.A. in English from Dartmouth College. He is married and has two children

ABOUT OUR GUEST POET

Ohio Poet Laureate Kari Gunter-Seymour is a ninth generation Appalachian. She's the editor of the Women of Appalachia Project anthologies, "Women Speak," Volumes 1-6; and "Essentially Athens Ohio," an anthology focused on landmarks, tales, and experiences of those living in, or deeply connected to, Athens County. She holds a B.F.A. in graphic design and an M.A. in commercial photography. She is also a retired instructor in the E.W. Scripps School of Journalism at Ohio University. A poem she wrote in support of families living in poverty in Athens County, Ohio, went viral and has been seen by more than 100,000 people, resulting in thousands of dollars donated to her local food pantry.
